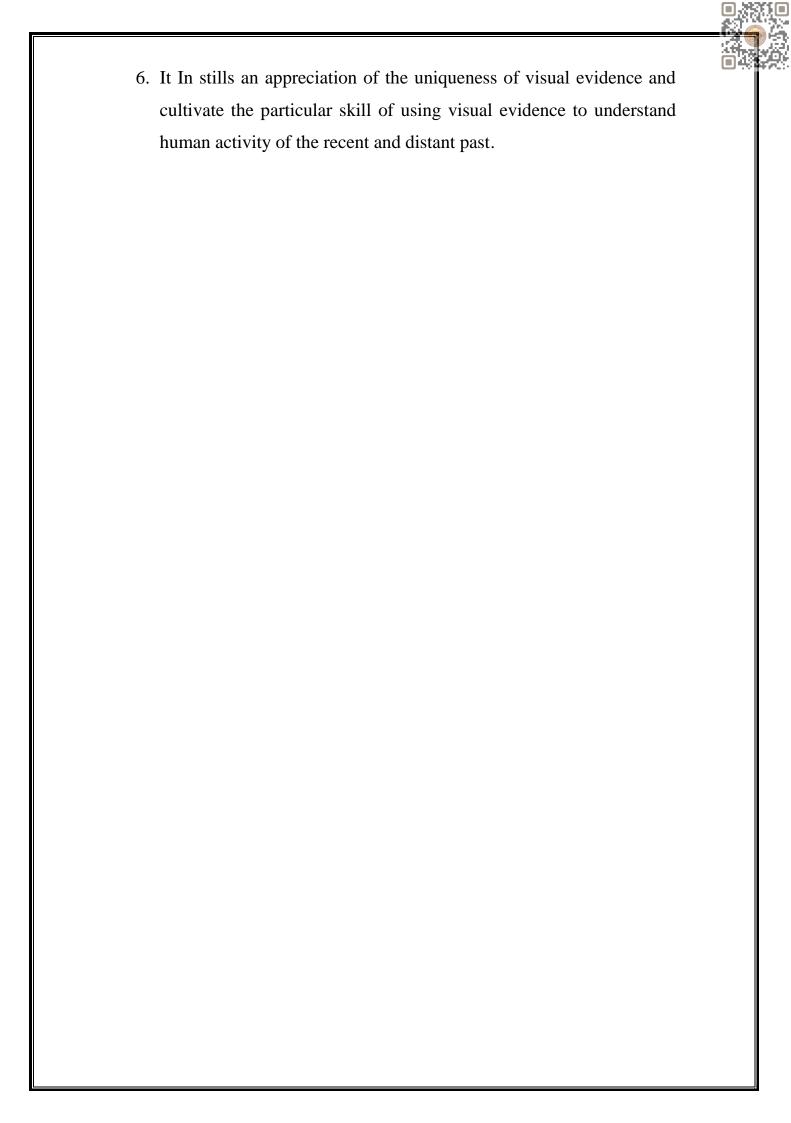
The objective of this course is to:

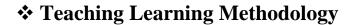
